A Message From Our President

Falling In Line in the Fall



Autumn has become my favorite season by far. While the other three have their virtues, there is really nothing that can beat the many fabulous elements of a good fall day. The weather has (hopefully) cooled from the dog days of summer, the visual cacophony of an

ever-changing landscape is magnificent, and need I even mention the return of collegiate sports, rivalries and spirit?

Most importantly, there is a kick-start energy to beginning a new year, whether scholastically or religiously. Few things are more compelling about this period than our own Jewish High Holidays season.

A reflective time to think about the year past and the year forthcoming is important regardless of one's religious persuasion. The fact that we, as Jews, have a designated window of time and process for accomplishing this in a way that provides symmetry and context to our lives is nothing short of stupendous.

In addition to the High Holidays, there are many other colorful rejuvenations – literally and figuratively – that are currently in the works at Temple Beth-El and that I want to update you on today.

The most obvious of these is the work being done to our physical structure. Through the collaborative efforts of campaign chair Jimmy Krell, the Temple Beth-El Foundation, the TBE Board of Directors, the house committee, the generosity of our increasing list of donors, and the input of a subcommittee that has marshaled the numerous details of this project along, we have taken the ultimate stack of lemons and crafted it into the sweetest of lemonades. Many of the efforts of these months of hard work will be on display during the High Holidays. Others are

forthcoming with an ultimate complete date later this fall. Of course the resulting effort will have a much longer shelf life, benefiting us all individually and institutionally for years to come.

Our religious school year has started off with a bang, 65 students strong and growing. I have had more than one parent or grandparent confide in me, "I/my child didn't like going to religious school, so my child/grandchild doesn't have to like it either." I have a secret of my own to share. I have yet to see a child who looks miserable, disengaged or bored so far this year. As I walk from classroom to classroom most Wednesday afternoons and Sunday mornings, I sense an energy and spirit permeating through the hallways that is quite contagious. This is due in no small part to the creativity and dedication of our teachers, clergy and professional staff. It is going to be a great year.

The Moishe House program is beginning to gather both steam and interest with 20-something year old Jews throughout the Birmingham community. In addition to Temple Beth-El's efforts to bring this program to our city and to allow a TBE property to be used for this program, we have also garnered support from the other synagogues and clergy in town as well as the leadership of the Birmingham Jewish Federation. Moishe House Birmingham, which is slated to open towards the end of the 2011 calendar year, is a feather in the cap of our Jewish community as a whole and TBE in particular.

As the Days of Awe begin to swirl around us, I hope you will all join me in appreciating the rich and colorful patchwork to be found in the energy of the most special of all seasons and in the exciting times that lie ahead for Temple Beth-El.

Message From Our Education Department



As we enter the High Holy Day period I am drawn to Parshat *V'etchanan* which include some of the central elements of Jewish life. The essence of this portion is the *Aseret hadebroat* (The Ten

Commandments) which stands out as a defining code of Jewish behavior, this section includes also the *Shema*. The *Shema Yisrael* and the next five verses (Deut. 6:4-9), provide us with an understanding of our obligations to God. They make up one-third of the "*Kriat Shema*," read twice daily, and set forth the commandment to love God with all of our heart, soul and being. The *Shema* also commands us, "Teach them (the commandments) faithfully to your children." There are many ways that "your children" can be understood. The Torah means that we are obligated to teach our very own children, and by extension the children of our neighbors who may be at a disadvantage because of economic or familial circumstances.

Fulfilling the commandment to "teach your children" must be a driving force of every Jewish parent. If we hope our children will live with the beliefs and practices of our ancestors, Jewish education cannot be a supplementary activity. Jewish education that builds a deep understanding of our people's customs, laws and practices are indispensable and cannot be viewed as a luxury item. Like any important field of study, Judaism is far too important to end at Bar/Bat Mitzvah or confirmation ages. It is a commandment that must be fulfilled in order for the Jewish people to survive. The commitment of Temple Beth-El's leadership to make Jewish education

attainable for anyone in the community who desires it speaks to the highest level of *tzdakah* and *chesed*, but it cannot only be a communal priority. It also must be a core value of every family within our community.

There is also the second understanding of this commandment. In rabbinic literature students are considered, figuratively, to be the children of their teachers. So the obligation of providing a proper Jewish education is incumbent upon all those engaged in teaching Jewish youth as well. This means showing love and a commitment for each individual student. Part of this commitment requires that Jewish educators be responsible for upgrading and updating their skills in both subject matter and pedagogy. We are fortunate to be part of the Institute for Southern Jewish Life (ISJL) consortium for Jewish education. The curriculum and educators provided by the ISJL are among the finest available. TBE's use of these materials puts us on the cutting edge of current Jewish education trends.

The responsibility for proper fulfillment of the commandment of teaching Jewish children falls upon parents and educators. We must work together to make sure that Jewish children receive a well rounded and comprehensive Jewish education, organized around the best pedagogic practices. Our children's Jewish faith, practice and pride are too important to be left to chance. I hope you will join with me and the other educators at TBE to enhance and advance Jewish education programs at Temple Beth-El.

From the TBE Foundation

Your Foundation's Investment in Temple Beth-El's Renovation and Repair Project

In 2009, your Centennial donations retired TBE's considerable debt. The Foundation was then assigned stewardship of the remaining Centennial Campaign funds. With the funds the Foundation received a clear mandate:

“Manage these funds judiciously to protect and ensure that the Temple's building, programming and educational services meet the future needs of our congregation.”

Consistent with that mandate and the goals of the Centennial Campaign, the Deferred Maintenance Fund and the Centennial Education/Programming Fund were initiated to house the remaining Centennial pledges in the Foundation.

The Foundation's preparation for the inevitable building repairs and updating of the building allowed the Foundation to step up and financially help when our offices unfortunately flooded from a broken pipe. This repair project has become a wonderful opportunity to reconfigure and renovate the areas used for Temple business, social and educational programs. The Temple's building will reach its 100 year mark in 2026. These much needed improvements will keep our building and programming vibrant as we reach this milestone.

In July, TBE's Board of Directors made a formal request to the Foundation for funding to support the renovation campaign. After careful consideration, the Foundation Board agreed to release up to \$150,000 of Deferred Maintenance Funds with the understanding that the remaining money be raised from the Congregation. This fund raising campaign is currently being conducted and congregants are being asked to make a 3 year pledge.

In addition to the renovation project, our historic building also requires some major repairs. These repairs will be conducted at the same time as the renovations and will require additional funding. The following are the three (3) specific areas of the building needing attention:

- 1) The roof of the education building requires replacement.
- 2) The windows on the west side of the building must be replaced. As a part of the building's envelope, the windows are failing and no longer keep the moisture at bay.
- 3) The mortar, brick and pointing, on the west side also requires repair.

In August, the Temple Board of Directors made an additional request to the Foundation Board of Directors for up to \$275,000 from the Deferred Maintenance Fund. These funds will be used to pay for the needed Temple repairs listed above. The House Committee and the building professionals are all looking for economic methods for conducting these repairs and the Foundation Board is being very prudent with the Deferred Maintenance Fund. The Centennial Planning Committee showed great foresight when they created the Deferred Maintenance Fund as part of the Centennial Campaign goals and the Foundation Board understands its stewardship role for this necessary fund.

The Foundation has completed its Golden Anniversary year and the Foundation Board looks forward to planning for and providing another 50 years of support to Temple Beth-El. There are many ways to give, and the Foundation can help you craft a plan for giving. The Foundation Executive Director, Barbara Gordon, President Jimmy Krell, or any Foundation Director would be pleased to talk with you about your participation in securing the Temple's financial future.

Adult Education

Synagogue Survival 101 - My People's Prayer Book

The purpose of this course is to open up the traditional Jewish prayer book as a spiritual resource.

The course presents diverse and exciting commentaries to the traditional liturgy, helping the student find new wisdom and guidance in Jewish prayer, and bring the liturgy into their lives. Using the text "Minhag Ami - My People's Prayer Book", edited by Laurence Hoffman, we will study commentaries from various perspectives of the Jewish world, covering the prayer book's connections to the Bible, history, Halacha (Jewish law), Kabbalistic and Hassidic wisdom, feminism, modern developments, and much more.

Taught by Cantor Gale, Synagogue Survival 101 meets on Thursdays from noon to 1pm. Class begins after the High Holidays. Contact the office or Cantor Gale if you are interested.

Introduction to Judaism

Judaism is the dynamic and inspirational religion of the Jewish people, going back over 3,500 years. Jewish tradition encompasses Jewish philosophy, thought, culture, and observance. In this introductory course, those who are seeking to enhance their Jewish knowledge, including those who are contemplating conversion, those who are married to a Jewish man or woman, those from an assimilated Jewish background, and those who were actively raised as Jews, can learn about the wisdom and beauty of this wonderful tradition and oldest of the monotheistic faiths.

Through an intensive study of the holidays and life-cycle including readings from the Hebrew Bible, rabbinic literature, the prayer-book, and philosophy texts, students will enhance their understanding of Jewish history, culture, and tradition. *The course will meet on designated Sundays, 9:00-11:00 am, with Rabbi Michelle Goldsmith serving as the spiritual guide into this compelling tradition.*

Pirkei Ha-Shavua ("Chapters for the Week")

For over a thousand years, Jews have been referred to as The People of the Book. Although in modern times part of our Jewish identity is based on our historic commitment to study as evidenced by this name, too often we have not really read "the Book," the Tanakh (the Five Books of Moses and the fascinating books of Writings and Prophets). Come learn what it's all about!

Last year we began with Deuteronomy. This year we continue our studies in Joshua and will move on to Samuel I and II and Kings I and II. This will be an exciting journey through the former Prophets. Our goal will be to read two or three chapters of the Tanakh each week. We will be using The Jewish Study Bible by Oxford and employing pre-distributed questions to guide our reading and study. *Tuesdays noon-1:00 pm with Rabbi Michelle Goldsmith.* For more questions or to register, please call 933-2740. Jewish Folk Literature and Short Stories

Stories are a window into the culture, history, beliefs, hopes, fears, and superstitions of a people. In this light hearted course we will look at one or two Jewish folk tales and/or short stories each week. We will read the stories in class, discuss them, and see what they teach us about ourselves and the people who told and/or wrote the stories. No preparation is needed and each class will be "stand alone," so you can drop by any time. *Tuesdays 1:00-2:00 pm beginning October 18, Rabbi Michelle Goldsmith instructor.*

Renovations Update

Renovations of our 21st Way entrance—the entry to our offices and congregational lounge/library—are moving along smoothly. Key design features include the display of our Holocaust Torah, which will be the centerpiece of the main entryway leading to the chapel; the Congregational Gathering Area, which will offer a contemporary Library/Lounge that will include roll-out work tables, wireless internet throughout, and a quiet space for Judaic study; and modern offices with up-to-date furnishings and equipment to help office staff track the myriad of financial, ritual life, and security needs of the synagogue.

The Renovation Design Team includes architects Scott Boomhover and Danielle Weintraub, construction contractors Eric Goldis and Lori Dorsky, House Committee Chair Julian Brook, and Board President Vikki Grodner.

Due to additional work on the Educational Wing windows and roofing, the entire project will not be completed until December, 2011. However, we are pleased to share that the hallways and entrance at 21st Way will be fully operational and open over the High Holidays. 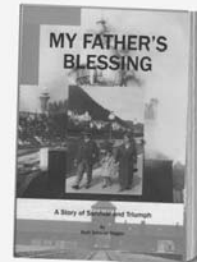
